<u>Happy New Year!</u> I hope everyone had a lovely Christmas break. It has been fantastic to welcome everyone back to school this week and the children have got off to a very positive start to 2018, already having a class trip to a real life space capsule, a gymnastics festival and after school clubs underway!

EDP Visit: Sue Smith, our Education Development Partner, visited Governors to analyse our 2017 data this week. She was thrilled (as are we) with the outcomes, especially the progress our Y6 pupils made last year from KS1. We are in the top 10% of schools in the country for achieving the highest levels of progress in Reading and Writing and in the top 5% nationally for Maths! This is a tremendous achievement and I cannot thank every member of staff, governors and parents enough for their support in ensuring such positive outcomes for our children. Long may it continue!

<u>After school clubs:</u> If your child has committed to joining an after school club, please ensure they attend every week. It is unfair on those who didn't manage to get in if a place is not being kept regularly by someone else. Also, please ensure an adult is there to collect children at the end of every club <u>on time</u>, as it is distressing for children who have to wait to be collected once everyone else has left. Thank you
