Durham Cathedral Leaver's Service: For the first time, WCPS Y6 pupils were invited to attend the Leaver's Service at the magnificent Durham Cathedral. Hundreds of children attend the ceremony and I was extremely proud to join our 4 Banner Bearers, who walked in procession down the length of the aisle, proudly carrying our school banner. This was an occasion which our Year 6 pupils will never forget and the start of an annual tradition for our school. Well don, Year 6 for your fantastic conduct: you were a credit to our school and to yourselves.

<u>Transition Days</u>: There are a number of transition visits arranged for Year 6 pupils (and Year 5 for Curriculum Week) going to their various feeder secondary schools over the coming weeks. <u>Apart from the 3</u> <u>day main transition visit on July 11<sup>th</sup> -14<sup>th</sup></u>, the children come to school here as usual and travel to the secondaries, returning here for home-time.

<u>Year 3 & Author Visit:</u> This week our Y3 and 4 children went to Timothy Hackworth Primary to work with children's author Vivienne French. It was wonderful for our pupils to work collaboratively with children in another school and they have since been doing some follow-up poetry work back in school. Well done, everyone!

Mrs Smith had worked hard to rehearse a Russian song with the children and they performed beautifully, receiving rapturous applause at the end!
