Thank you! I would like to start this week's newsletter by thanking everyone who responded so promptly to our emergency evacuation due to the burst water pipe this week. Obviously, such incidents are rare and completely beyond our control and closing the school is always a last resort. However, such incidents also highlight the importance of parents / carers ensuring they inform the school of any changes to contact telephone numbers as we had a few children whose parents we were unable to contact: please call into the office to update your contact information if you have not done so for a while.

<u>MacMillan Coffee Morning</u>: A massive thank you to everyone who attended our Coffee Morning last Friday in aid of Macmillan .The grand total we raised was £78.45

Harvest Festival and Soup Kitchen: We have changed the day for our soup kitchen to <u>Wednesday 17th</u> <u>October.</u> Sarah McAllister, our Family Learning chef, will be working with the children to make vegetable soup, which they will then serve from 2.15pm in the school kitchen. We will be asking £1 a cup, with some freshly baked bread and all proceeds will go to Woodhouse Close Church Foodbank.

<u>Curriculum Activities</u>: What an exciting week of learning we have had in school! This week, children have participated in a Handball Festival where they showed excellent team skills. Year 5 enjoyed a fantastic Viking day where they experienced life as a Viking. We then had a 'Hands on Science' day, where every class got the chance to do an exciting practical science investigation, with Year 6 even dissecting real hearts!

<u>Headlice</u>: we have had several reports of children with headlice in school this week. Please check your child's hair regularly and treat with a headlice comb and lotion to ensure any eggs / live lice are cleared fully. Thank you.

<u>Wellies:</u> we will be continuing with our hugely successful OPAL playground programme and we need every child to provide a pair of NAMED wellies if they are to access the school field / yard in bad weather. A warm waterproof coat needs to be worn every day as the children will be outside even if it's rainy, just as they are in Early Years! Astronomical Attendance:

The threshold for what is termed as persistent absence has been determined as 90%, as opposed to 85% previously. Unfortunately, we are unable to authorise term time holidays as we have to follow the Government and Durham County protocol. The Durham County protocol explains that penalty notices must be issued 'in instances of unauthorised holidays in term time (where the holiday gives rise to 7 days or more unauthorised absence in any period...). The school processes absences and then the County Council pick up on unauthorised absence and this will be enforced by penalty payments and even court action.
