Halloween Disco: The children enjoyed a Halloween treat on Wednesday, with a spooky disco. Everyone looked suitably scary and I would like to thank parents and carers for the efforts made to dress the children up.

<u>Firefighters Assembly:</u> We invited Green Watch from Bishop Auckland Fire Station to speak to the whole school about bonfire and firework safety. They delivered a fun assembly which had a serious message about the firework code and how to stay safe at this time of the year.

Remembrance: On Sunday 11th November, a special service of Remembrance will be held at Woodhouse Close Church at 9.45 am. We hope to have some of our Year 6 pupils representing our school. The congregation are then invited to make their way the St Annes Church in the Market Place for a community service of remembrance and commemoration.

Purple Bus: This meek, I met with Graeme from AYCC to organise WCPS being able to use the Big Purple Bus. This is a specially adapted soft-play activity double decker bus free to use for schools in the local area as part of the Gaunless Gateway initiative. I have booked the bus for the end of term behaviour treat, for all of the children who have never had their names put onto the Class Tracking sheet all term. Make sure you're on it!

<u>Breakfast Club:</u> We have on average 80 children attending Breakfast Club daily which is fantastic! However, we must insist that <u>ONLY children paying to attend Breakfast Club are allowed to arrive</u> <u>between 8.10 and 8.45am</u>. Children who do not pay to come to Breakfast Club must not arrive before 8.45. If you pay for Breakfast Club, we expect you to eat some breakfast!

Breakfast Club Library: From Monday, we will be running Breakfast Library every morning from 8.15-8.45am. You are welcome to have a cuppa for 20p, whilst sharing a book with your child. Every child who attends will earn an extra 5 Dojos by receiving a Breakfast Reading Token. The timetable is as follows:

The threshold for what is termed as persistent absence has been determined as 90%, as opposed to 85% previously. Unfortunately, we are unable to authorise term time holidays as we have to follow the Government and Durham County protocol. The Durham County protocol explains that penalty notices must be issued 'in instances of unauthorised holidays in term time (where the holiday gives rise to 7 days or more unauthorised absence in any period...). The school processes absences and then the County Council pick up on unauthorised absence and this will be enforced by penalty payments and even court action.

Lateness: 98 minutes lost due to 11 children being late this last fortnight: this is lost learning time, please and improvements for those children must be seen next week. We are monitoring attendance and punctuality on a weekly basis and letters to invite parents and carers to attendance meetings with Kirsty and Mrs Page will be sent if improvements are not seen over a 2 week period. Following this, referrals to the County Enforcement Team will be implemented.
