
#### YEAR 2 TRIP TO DURHAM CATHEDRAL

## What we are reading this week .....




#### Teacher Recommendation Mrs Gorton

Last week I decided to read the The Girl Who Speaks Bear and I absolutely loved it and my favourite part has to be when Yanka's pet weasel does his war dance.

This book is about a young girl called Yanka who as a baby was found in a bear cave, taken to the village and raised by her foster mother Mamochka. As she grows up, Yanka

feels different to the other children; she's bigger and stronger than all them. She begins to wonder why she is different and where she came from. One day something strange happens to Yanka and her legs turn into bear legs. She decides the only way to find out is to sneak away from the village on a quest to discover her true family, and who she really is. Once in the Snow Forest Yanka faces many dangers and discovers that all the fantastic stories she had been told as she grew up were true.



## FOCUS ON....YEAR 2



#### This refers to the work Year 2 did in the last week of last half term.

Year 2 have been really busy.

On Monday in numeracy, we used multilink cubes to help work out our number bonds to 20. Art was very challenging, we attempted to do some paper weaving. In English, we have been using expanded noun phrases to improve our Flat Stanley work. This involved using 2 adjectives and a noun in a sentence and remembering to use a comma. On Tuesday, we walked to Bishop Barrington School and took part in a sports event where we tried kurling and boccia activities. Everyone worked really hard and the behaviour was impeccable!

In science we have been discussing healthy eating, focusing on the 5 food groups: fruit and veg, proteins, carbohydrates, fats and spreads and dairy.

In R.E. we have introduced the story of St. Cuthbert, so that we have some knowledge of who he is before our visit to Durham Cathedral after the holidays. We looked at E-safety in ICT using the story of The Three Little Pigs.

Music was great fun, we used xylophones and sang along to 'In my hands, In my heart'

## Attendance



#### Article 28: You have the right to a good quality education.

Attendance - Attendance at school is crucial. Parents / carers have a legal obligation to ensure their child attends school. School will do all we can to ensure parents / carers are supported in ensuring their children have good attendance.

Every day at school counts and makes a difference.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Generally, the higher the percentage of sessions missed across the key stage at KS2 and KS4, the lower the level of attainment at the end of the key stage.
- Among pupils with no missed sessions over KS2, 83.9% achieved the expected standard compared to 40.2% of pupils who were persistently absent.
- To be classed as persistently absent, your child has to miss 10% or more of school sessions (1 session is half a day). Over a year that equates to roughly 19 days absence.

We continue to place high importance on attendance and punctuality. Classes receive rewards and shout outs in our celebration assemblies for having the highest attendance and punctuality on a weekly basis. We teach our children the importance of attending school regularly and on time. If your child's attendance falls below 97% then the attendance team will be in touch with you to offer support and work with you to improve your child's attendance. This will also be the case for those children who are persistently late or who have an emerging pattern of attendance over a time period.
