
Financial help and support for families - A dedicated web page <u>Help with your money</u> has been developed for County Durham residents and contains specific help for families. The page has information on a range of support available including applying for Free School Meals (FSM), debt advice/financial help and help with heating and fuel bills.

Help with buying items for school including school uniforms - A dedicated web page has been developed for families to find out about this support <u>Help with buying items for school - Durham</u> County Council

The Bread and Butter Thing (TBBT)- TBBT collects surplus food and staple goods that often end up going to waste from supermarkets, factories and farms, and distributes it at a discount price through 10 community hubs across County Durham (Our closest one is St Andrew's Primary). You will need to become a member to use the service, but this is free to do. For just £7.50, TBBT members' shopping bags can be filled with an average of £35 worth of items made up of quality, nutritious food. Each week members can access three bags of produce, including fresh fruit and vegetables, chilled goods, as well as cupboard staples such as pasta and cereal.

FOCUS ON....RECEPTION



Reception have settled in amazingly. It is a big step starting big school but boys and girls, you have smashed it!! Since starting Reception, children have worked really hard together on out class charter – our school rules and we are getting there. Children are starting to use the areas, playing and cooperating well and its lovely to see this grow and flourish. Day by day children are starting to find and develop their independence skills and this is something that will grow and develop throughout the year.

We started the week by making our first tally chart. This was to see how each of us get to school each day. The children have enjoyed discussing with each other and their teachers the different modes of transport we use to get to school and then marking their tally on the interactive board. We used language around transport but also mathematical language such as more than, less than and the same as.

Following on from this we then went for a walk around our local area, the children enjoyed showing Mrs Taylor, Mrs Kent and Brogan around Woodhouse estate. We talked about the different sized houses we could see and learnt all about bungalows and houses and the differences between them. It was interesting to hear the children talk about where they lived and them showing us as we walked.

We talked about road safety, roundabouts and road signs. The children knew that a road sign informed us about the direction of a particular place. All the children were so well behaved and we had such an enjoyable afternoon – they were a pleasure to be out and about with.


When we got back to school, we then drew our own map from or walk, adding places and pictures on to the map. Staff were blown away about what the children had remembered whilst out on our walk, mirroring some of the language staff had modelled.

In English, we have been exploring the Rainbow Fish story. Reception staff are astounded with the children's descriptions of the story, the language they have used. Mrs Curry and Mrs Smith popped down and heard lots of children using personification and alliteration when describing the waves. We have explored and talked about the different textures of treasures we can find under the sea and learnt a variety of new vocabulary to build our own sentences.

We have also had a teddies bear picnic this week. During the picnic we have expanded our mathematical language when we were comparing to see which teddy had less and more? Which teddy's cup was empty and which one was full. The children really enjoyed this, sharing the tomatoes out equally to make it fair on the teddy.

To those who have been in school all week, well done! We have had amazing week! Let's keep it up. Staff are excited to see where this adventure will take us.

Attendance is so important. In Reception staff work incredibly hard to lay the foundation of learning which children build on throughout their time in primary school. Inconsistent and poor attendance will have such negative implications not only on your child's academic progress, but also their social and emotional development too.

This will also be the case for those children who are persistently late or who have an emerging pattern of attendance over a time period.
